What is Title I?

Snapfinger Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. Our school will designate counselors Dr. Johnson and Mrs. to collaborate with feeder schools and to the extent feasible and appropriate with Head Start, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parent as Teachers Program to support students and families. Additionally, we will provide families and students support in transitioning to kindergarten, third and fifth grades by inviting parents and students to a rising kindergarten, third, and fifth grade orientation at our school. Additionally, we will provide families and students support in transitioning to middle school.
